

## Christmas 2010 Mystery Quilt

When the quilting is done, add this dimensional appliqué to add a little interest to your quilt, if you like! *See you soon with a photo of our finished project!*

### Supplies

red scraps (*for knot and streamers*)  
 small scrap of fabric for knot lining, at least 4 x 8-inches  
 small scrap of thin batting, at least 4 x 8-inches  
 sewing machine, matching thread, and hand needle



1/4-inch seams throughout, *unless noted*

### Step 26: Cutting

For Knot: cut 3, 1 1/2-inch by 7-inch strips.

For Streamer: cut 4, 1 1/2-inch by width of fabric, and 2, 3-inch by width of fabric strips.

### Step 26: Sewing

For the Knot: Sew the three Knot strips together along the 7-inch edge; press. Layer batting, lining, and strip set (right-side up) and sew using a 1/2-inch seam allowance, along both long edges leaving short edges open of turning. Turn right side-out with batting in between lining and strip set; trim to 6-inches long. Hand baste short edges closed. Overlap short edges 1/2-inch and hand sew together forming a tube. Center knot on the quilted bow and sew back part of the knot (hiding the hand stitched seam) to the quilt.

For the Streamer: Sew the Streamer strips together; make 2 sets; press. Layer the strip sets wrong sides together and trim the ends at a 45-degree angle as shown. Starting on one long side, sew around the strip sets leaving 8-inches open for turning. Turn Streamer right-side out; press. Hand stitch opening closed. Pull Streamer through Knot (tube) on quilt; hand tack in place, if desired.
