

Penny Candy Fridge Magnets

Novelty erasers abound in the party aisle or dollar stores. Wrapped in plastic, they make cute “penny candy” fridge magnets. So easy the kids can make them; a great group project for sure!

You will need

assorted rubber novelty-style erasers
plastic wrap, *stiff, crinkly kind**
craft magnets, about 1/2-inch round, 1 for each eraser

scissors, tacky-type craft glue

Cut plastic wrap to go around magnet horizontally with a slight overlap (about 1/4-inch) and with an overhang of about 3/4 to 1-inch on both sides of eraser; test fit and trim, if necessary. Add a thin drop of glue to the back of the eraser, wrap plastic wrap around eraser, and secure with another thin drop of glue. Take care not to get glue on plastic wrap since it is hard to remove. When glue is dry, twist open ends of plastic wrap a few times to close, “candy-style” as shown. Glue magnet to the back of each and allow to dry completely.

*We used some left-over stiff plastic treat bags we had on-hand, cut to size. You may even be able to recycle some plastic you already have!

Erik's Tip:

Look for these erasers at your local craft or dollar store throughout the year and made “candies” for every holiday!
