

Our Susannah!

Quilt

Designed with a center field of classic Rail Fence blocks, make your *Susannah! Quilt* as scrappy as you like! We cut our strips at random from 11 different fabrics, thinking a larger number of scraps makes the quilt more interesting! If you don't have a lot of scraps, we have given an idea of the yardage below. Save the left over pieces of fabric to use later in your quilt. Page 2 will post next week!



Supplies

rotary cutter and 6 x 24-inch ruler

rotary cutting mat

sewing machine and matching thread

assorted fabric scraps that are width of fabric or about 1 1/2 yards of 5 different fabrics. (*We are using more of our pink fabric because we are using one pink strip at the end of every strip set*)

1/4-inch seams throughout

Step 1: Cutting

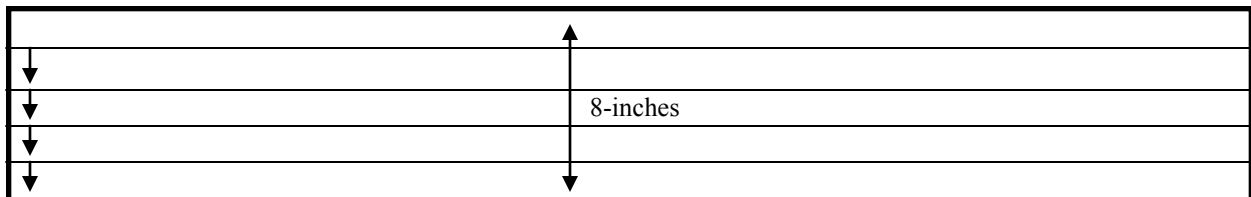
Cut 50, 2-inch strips width of fabric (wof).

Step 1: Sewing

Sew 5 strips together, in random order, as shown below. Your strip set should measure 8-inches across. Make 10 strip sets.

Erik's Tip

Press your strip sets cross-wise on your ironing board to avoid an arching effect!



Press seams in the same direction.
