Traditional Setting Step 9

continue the quilt assembly

This step will add the top and bottom pieced borders of the 'Traditional Setting' quilt. We will offer the finishing steps broken down into sewing steps, much like the blocks, so that those who are working on the quilt as it posts may continue to follow along while continuing to finish their quilt. There are just a couple of steps to finish the 'Traditional Setting'; soon the 'Non-Traditional' Setting instructions will begin.



Supplies

8 previously made 6 1/2-inch blocks (any 8 blocks)

rotary cutter and mat sewing machine and matching thread

Green Floral 2 3/4 yards, for the pieced borders

For the Traditional Setting quilt, we will be showing blocks made in a different colorway than our usual red, white, and blue. These blocks were made to test the pattern...you may find photos of most of these blocks in the 'Ben Franklin Blocks' photo album on the left side of our Main/Home Page. The usual red, white, and blue blocks will be featured in the Non-Traditional Setting posting later.

**A note about these fabrics:

Cutting:

Green Floral 7 strips 6 1/2-inches by width of fabric (44-inches) *Set aside the remaining fabric for the side borders*

1/4-inch seams throughout; press seams as indicated.

Constructing the top and bottom pieced borders:

Sew four previously made 6 1/2-inch blocks together as shown below. Press in the direction of the arrows.
